

Design Status






- Thirty-two engineering contracts totaling \$252.9 million awarded since 2012
- Thirty construction contracts totaling \$561.7 million awarded since 2012
- Eleven construction contracts complete; seven more scheduled for completion this year
- Thirteen total construction contracts starting in 2015; four more this year
- Seven construction contracts starting in 2016



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Construction Implementation Timeline



Utility Coordination in EOWA Project Corridor

- 800+ individual utility conflicts identified to date with 1,000+ anticipated
- Coordinating with more than 20 utility and pipeline companies
 - Cooperation among all parties has helped minimize costs and delays due to utility relocations
- Joint relocations (where multiple utilities collaborate on relocation by using one contractor) have been very successful




Intergovernmental Agreements (IGAs)

- Approximately 100 IGAs at project completion
- IGAs often include multiple parties
- Each can take a year to complete
- Documentation of agency involvement and contract requirements
- Tollway has IGAs (or MOUs or LOUs) with more than 36 agencies

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


Illinois Route 390 Tolling Segments

Toll Collection System Type and Layout

- First all-electronic tolling (AET) corridor
- Mainline tolling system selected
 - Communities emphasized the need for equitable tolling
 - Mainline tolling system provides more equitable costs for drivers
 - Encourages both short- and long-distance trips
 - Provides congestion relief on adjacent secondary roadways
- Tolling expected to begin following construction of major roadway segments
 - Illinois Route 390 from Lake Street (U.S. Route 20) to I-290 scheduled for completion end of 2015 – toll collection to begin in summer 2016
 - Illinois Route 390 from I-290 to Busse Road (Illinois Route 83) scheduled for completion end of 2017 – toll collection to begin by the end of 2017
- Details regarding tolling for the north-south corridor to be developed with future design

Business Terms for Illinois Tollway Customers

- I-PASS customers will pay via existing accounts
 - I-PASS discount on tolls will be 50 percent for cars and 33 percent for trucks
- Other customers will have two options for payment
 - Seven days to pay (extended to 30 days for first month)
 - License plate violation search on new website
- Violators will have lower fines
 - \$10 per violation at time of notice (\$20 elsewhere on Tollway)
 - \$25 per escalated violation (\$50 elsewhere on Tollway)
 - Violation notices will be for Illinois Route 390 only





Illinois Route 390 provides unique piloting opportunity

- Isolated violation notices
- Potential for high volume of rental car traffic
- Potential pilots for Illinois Route 390
 - Incentives for transponder usage
 - Smartphone app for rental car customers
 - Enhanced data-driven lane technology maintenance activities
 - Improved lane shut-down approach for lane technology maintenance activities
 - New signage to better communicate toll payment options

Illinois Route 390 Tolling Communication Plan

- Extensive community outreach will be conducted in advance of start of tolling.
- Potential outreach activities include:
 - Series of drop in centers and roadshow events in affected communities
 - Print and electronic notifications
 - Roadside signs
 - Enewsletter and email blasts
 - Potential temporary I-PASS Customer Service Center




