### Record of Meeting | March 25, 2021

The Illinois State Toll Highway Authority ("Tollway") held the regularly scheduled Diversity and Inclusion Committee meeting on Thursday, March 25 2021. The meeting was held pursuant to the By-Laws of the Tollway upon call and notice of the meeting executed by Chairman Willard S. Evans, Jr. and posted in accordance with the requirements of the Open Meetings Act, 5 ILCS 120/1, et seq.

Due to necessary precautions relating to COVID-19, in accordance with the Gubernatorial Disaster Proclamation and current conditions, and consistent with the Open Meetings Act, it was determined by Chairman Willard S. Evans, Jr. that an in-person meeting of the body was neither practical nor prudent. In compliance with all conditions of Open Meetings Act, 5 ILCS 120/7(e), the Committee meeting was conducted by audio conference. A telephone access number was provided for members of the public to monitor and/or participate in the meeting.

#### **Public Comment**

Committee Chair Davis opened the floor for public comment. No public comment was offered.

#### **Committee Chair's Items**

#### **Executive Director's Items**

Executive Director Alvarez introduced Terry Miller, Chief of Diversity & Strategic Development, to present to the Committee an update on Tollway Diversity Initiatives. <u>See attached presentation</u>.

Committee Chair Davis thanked Mr. Miller for his presentation.

Executive Director Alvarez next introduced Dee Brookens, Chief Procurement and Compliance Officer, to present to the Committee a presentation on the Tollway's 2021 Disparity Studies. See attached presentation.

### **Items for Consideration**

#### **Procurement**

Executive Director Alvarez called on Dee Brookens, Chief Procurement and Compliance Officer, to present to the Committee the following items:

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<u>Item 1</u>: Award of Contract 21-0023 to Colette Holt & Associates for the purchase of a Business Enterprise Program ("BEP") Availability and Disparity Study in an amount not to exceed \$316,152.50 (CMS Joint Purchase).

<u>Item 2</u>: Award of Contract 20-0023 to Colette Holt & Associates for the purchase of an Illinois Tollway Availability and Disparity Study in an amount not to exceed \$372,800.00 (Tollway Request for Proposal).

Director Paddock inquired if there are concerns about receiving only a single bid in response to the request for proposals for these items. Ms. Brookens responded in the affirmative, noting that outreach was performed to get feedback from all vendors that received the solicitation but did not bid. She further stated that the specialized nature of the industry is a factor in the limited number of responses.

Directors and staff discussed whether the Tollway's disparity program might benefit from more frequent review. Chairman Evans stated that staff should examine how assessments might occur more frequently to ensure timely analysis of the Tollway's disparity programming is being performed. He also suggested that staff reach out to academic institutions and other potential vendors to develop relationships which might spur additional competition on bid solicitations for these services.

Committee Chair Davis noted that the vendor for the proposed contracts will be seeking input from Directors through individual interviews.

Upon conclusion of the presentation and discussion of these items, Committee Chair Davis stated Director Gomez has indicated in advance her wish to recuse herself on Procurement Items 1 and 2.

Committee Chair Davis entertained a motion to approve **Procurement Item 1**, as presented. Director Connolly made a motion to approve this item, seconded by Director McConnaughay. Chair Davis asked that the roll be called on the motion, the vote of yeas and nays being as follows:

# WHAT IS A DISPARITY STUDY?

A disparity study is a comprehensive analysis of the market availability and utilization of businesses owned by historically underrepresented populations used to set diversity goals.

It is required to establish a legal basis for a diversity program that is not race or gender neutral, such as our BEP and DBE programs.



# **DISPARITY STUDY GOALS**

- **Develop and support programs and services** that will increase access to economic opportunities for historically underrepresented individuals, including minorities, exoffenders, women, economically disadvantaged individuals and veterans.
- **Determine if the need exists** for such programming through a data-driven examination of market conditions for historically underrepresented businesses.
- Establish attainable goals which encompass DBE, MBE, SBA 8(a), and WBE firms for all eligible goods and services, construction and professional and consultant services contracts.
- Leverage resulting study when considering the incorporation of remedies into existing programs and when suggesting new programs, such as unbundling, small business set-asides, access to capital, and owner-provided insurance.



# RFP 20-0023 CONSTRUCTION AND PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This study will explore whether disadvantaged, minority-owned and women- owned businesses (D/M/WBEs) have equal access to Tollway contracts and ensure that Tollway-sponsored DBE programs adhere to legal standards.

### **Key Facts**

- Published on December 7, 2020 and sent to 1,485 vendors in BidBuy.
- Pre-bid conference on December 11, 2020 attended by three vendors.
- Single RFP response submitted by Colette Holt & Associates on January 6, 2021.
- Seven-person evaluation team comprised of members from the Tollway Compliance, Diversity, Engineering, and Legal Departments
- Collette Holt & Associates (proposed awardee) committed to 35.21% DBE goal.
- The selected vendor shall provide a written report within one (1) year of the Notice to Proceed.




# RFP 21-0023 GOODS AND SERVICES

This study will determine availability of ready, willing, able and qualified DBE/BEP for participation in non-construction goods and services contracts while determining if a disparity exists, and if so, what solutions or remedies could be implemented.

### **Key Facts**

- Shared cost, CMS led procurement sent to 307 vendors in BidBuy.
- RFP published on October 21, 2020.
- Pre-bid conference on October 29, 2020 attended by a single vendor.
- Single RFP response submitted by Colette Holt & Associates on November 12, 2020.
- Proposal reviewed by a three-person panel comprised of CMS staff.
- Collette Holt & Associates (proposed awardee) committed to 35% BEP goal.
- The selected Vendor shall provide a written report within 12 months, with a total of 36 months afforded for contingencies.
